# Languages

French and Japanese are taught in the classroom. Spanish, German and Mandarin are taught via the Virtual Learning Network, which is supported Online Learning.

### NCEA

International Students can collect credits towards the National Certificate of Educational Achievement (NCEA). German students can gain University Entrance, valid for German universities if they take the approved combination of subjects.

### Mgori Culture

About half of our students identify themselves as Maori. Maori culture is an important aspect of our school. Maori language and culture are taught. New international students are welcomed in a Maori ceremony, a Powhiri. You have the opportunity to see Maori Performing Arts, Kapa Haka and to participate in Maori cultural activities.

### Uniform

We have an attractive black and white uniform, worn by all students from year 9 - 13. We supply each of our International Students with a double set of new uniform items.

# Homestay

You will stay with one of our homestay families. Our Homestay Coordinator takes great care in matching students with suitable families. Often life-long friendships are made. Most homestays are in town, a few are in the countryside.

# Support Services

The Director of International Students, the Homestay Coordinator, the Manager of International Students and the International Prefects will look after you while you are here. The form teachers, Heads of House, Guidance Councillors and other staff are available to help with any concerns that may arise. We have a nurse at school. A doctor, physiotherapist and a dietician visit once a week.






surf School Lessons Once a week after school during the warmer months in Term 1 and 4 you can attend the WHS surf school. Surf boards and wetsuits are supplied. Teachers instruct novices to experienced surfies. Our popular surf beach, Westend Ohope, is a 10 minute drive from school. Students can also take lessons through a commercial surf school, Salt Spray Surf School.



New Zealand students' examination time in November, International students are offered fun activites and trips. Students select from a range of activities, which may include learn to fly a small plane, white water rafting, fishing, Maori culture, visiting Whale Island, Zipline Tours, Hobbiton, mountain biking in Rotorua or The Motu, Luging in Rotorua, visiting a primary school and introducing your culture to students there.
